CHERRY RAYMOND AWARD 2016 - 2018

Zonta International District 16 has established a permanent Award in memory of Cherry Raymond, Regional Representative 1972-1974, who established Zonta International in New Zealand and was subsequently elected Governor District 16 from 1990-1992. Cherry was a charter member of the Zonta Club of Auckland, and a committed advocate for women's rights and gender equality. The members of the Zonta Club of Auckland initiated the establishment of this Award in her memory and it was approved by the District 16 Conference in 2007.

- This award is granted for a successful **service or advocacy project**, undertaken by a Zonta Club in District 16, after 1 August 2015, that is considered by the District 16 Board to epitomise the Zonta mission of empowering women worldwide.
- Only one (1) award will be presented each biennium
- Only one (1) project can be nominated by each club
- Applications for this Award must come from the Club and be signed by the President and a Club officer.

The Club that receives this Award may exclusively use the by-line:
